IV. BOARD DISCUSSION

- A. State Report Card Data Tim Cybulski and Corey Kessler reviewed the state report card data for the district and individual buildings. The district's overall achievement level was a 4 (out of 5), and all of the components of the report card were shared (achievement, progress, gap closing, graduation, early literacy, college/career/work force readiness). Also, financial comparisons are also part of the report card, and Mr. Bain noted that the district had the 3rd lowest expenditure per pupil in Hamilton County. A handout was provided.
- **B. District & Building Goals Report for 2022-23** District and Building Administrators Building principals and assistant principals reviewed their goals for the year. Building goals included positive behavioral referrals, academic growth for all students, and mental wellbeing for students. A handout from each building was provided.
- C. High School GPA Calculations Update Travis Hunt and Dan Boles communicated that with board support, the high school will be moving from an 8 point grading scale to a 5 point grading scale, with weights still in place for courses that are more challenging. Also, class rank and scholarship opportunities will be evaluated during the transition to ensure all students are moved fairly through this process.
