



Building Compassion

In four days, OHLSD families and staff raised **\$17,034.46 for the Western Kentucky Tornado Relief Fund** after storms killed 25 Kentuckians and destroyed or damaged 1,300 homes.



Building a Safe School Culture

OHLSD continued to **expand its safety planning** by adding the position of Director of Safety and Security to the district administrative team; training all students and staff in the Standard Response Protocol (Run, Hide, Fight); and widely promoting the Safe School Hotline, accessible at www.ohlsd.org.

Building Competence

Teaching Entrepreneurship and Fostering Real-World Skills

- At Oak Hills High School, the Honors Startup Entrepreneurship class allows students to create and develop plans for their own product or service. Students leave the course with a business plan, competitive analysis, financial model, and communication and funding plans. Local entrepreneurs and business experts serve as coaches and mentors.
- After completing the Honors Startup Entrepreneurship class, students take part in the Entrepreneurship Pitch Night – better known as ‘Shark Tank.’ Teams of students take the stage to promote their potential start-up businesses and convince a panel of judges to invest in their product.
- Oak Hills High School offers classes that allow students to earn professional credentials before they graduate. The Introduction to Construction and Carpentry courses lead to the NCCER Core certification and Carpentry certification. The Supply Chain and Logistics course leads to Certified Logistics Associate (CLA) and Certified Logistics Technician certifications. Each course has a professional business partner.
- The University of Cincinnati offers its Early IT Program at OHHS. Students can take their first year of the undergraduate program at OHHS and earn guaranteed admission to the UC Bachelor of Science Informational Technology or Cybersecurity programs, with the ability to co-op the summer after high school graduation.
- At the elementary level, C.O. Harrison Elementary partners with the University of Cincinnati’s Alpaugh Family Economics Center to offer the Student Enterprise Program (StEP), which helps students develop 21st Century skills related to entrepreneurship, critical thinking and financial responsibility. Students earn school currency for achievement and good attendance and behavior, then can shop at an onsite store, save their money and accrue interest, or donate it to a nonprofit. COH was named UC’s StEP School of the Year in 2020.
