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

* Robotics team advanced

The Oak Hills Scotbot team worked tirelessly throughout the year to design and build a robot that fit the requirements for national competition. Students spent many hours after school and on weekends learning about computer programming and engineering in order to design and create their robot. Their hard work paid off when the team qualified for world championships held in St. Louis, Missouri, where they moved through the qualifications for an admirable finish among the top of the pack.

* 27 student athletes signed letters of intent

During the spring athletic signing the Highlanders proudly announced 27 athletes who signed their letters of intent. It was the largest collegiate signing class to date!

* AP and honors classes

Oak Hills offers 32 advanced placement courses in all of the core subjects of math, science, history and language arts. AP courses are also offered for electives such as foreign languages, arts, computer science, microeconomics and macroeconomics. Fourteen College Credit Plus courses are offered as another way to earn college credit without having to take an AP test or if an AP test is not available for that specific class. The high school also offers 48 honors classes.




NATIONAL MERIT FINALISTS

We are proud and appreciative of all of the good work done in our stadium!

* Community contributions

Oak Hills district students raised more than \$25,000 for the American Heart Association through jump-a-thons, basketball tournaments and donation drives. OHHS students donated \$29,750 to seven local charities through their 8th annual Walk Oak Hills including: Anderson Ferry Food Pantry, Delhi Township Senior Center, Green Township Senior Center and Honor Flight.

* Foundation support for music education & academics

The Oak Hills Alumni & Educational Foundation raised \$10,000 to support music education in each of our five elementary schools. Money was used to purchase stringed instruments. The Foundation also supported 27 education grants with more than \$12,000 to Oak Hills teachers. They were proud to support the ScotBot team in competition for an additional \$4,000 contribution.

* Athletic Boosters support the Highlanders

The Oak Hills Athletic Boosters donated \$85,000 to the district to support our student athletes, coaches and improve facilities. Items purchased included team awards, team travel for state advancement, chairs in the gym, Rapid Run Middle School scoreboard, baseball netting, weight room equipment upgrades, help with coaching clinics, training room supplies, timing system for the pool, improved signage, academic team buzzer system, soccer goal nets, offsite practice facilites, baseball and softball carts, parkas for swimming and diving teams, new track hurdles and new shot put area.

PRESCHOOL PROGRAM ACCOLADES

The District Preschool programs at J.F. Dulles and Delshire Elementary Schools have both been awarded a 5-Star rating for meeting the quality standard established by the Ohio Department of Job and Family Services and the Ohio Department of Education. The 5-Star Award is the highest-possible award. Step Up To Quality is a Five-Star Tiered Quality Rating and Improvement System created to recognize and promote early learning and development programs that meet quality standards over and above the health and safety licensing requirements. The preschool programs were awarded this rating on the following domains: Learning and Development: Administrative and Leadership Practices: Staff Qualifications and Professional Development; and Family and Community Partnerships.





TECHNOLOGY IN THE CLASSROOM

The district is saving more than \$100,000 a year in software license and server fees by adopting G Suite in 2009. Based on these benefits, the district supplied Chromebooks to every student in grades 1-12 in 2016-17 with the opportunity to take them home each night. Chromebooks cost 26% less than similar devices and also help prepare students for Ohio's state testing, which is conducted online. This program provides easier access to technology for all students and allows for an interactive learning experience. Using Google suites allows students to sign into their Google accounts and access their documents and email from any device, anywhere.
