

CAPSTONE CREATIVITY

Oak Hills High School senior Jordan Asman noticed something missing from museums throughout the Tri-State, accessible tours for the hearing impaired. Using her ASL and engineering background she created an app for the National Underground Railroad Freedom Center.



"When museums give guided tours, the deaf community can't exactly go on them unless they have an interpreter with them," she explained. Interpretation services often come at an extra cost; Asman's app includes pre-recorded videos and provides a guided tour in American Sign Language for guests free of charge.

Now in its seventh year, this family-friendly staff volleyball tournament raised \$10,200 to help district families suffering hardship. Since 2012, we've served 23 families and raised \$56,796!

STOP THE BLEED



The Oak Hills Alumni & Educational Foundation donated \$21,000 to the district for the purchase of 550 stop-the-bleed kits for every classroom and district vehicle. Thanks to the generosity of our alumni, staff, community partners and friends of Oak Hills, we will be prepared to administer first-aid to wounded victims before first responders can arrive on the scene. We appreciate the collaboration between both Delhi and Green Township Fire Departments, University of Cincinnati Emergency Medicine and TriHealth to get all of our staff and teachers trained on using the kits and supplies. Thank you!

GIVING BACK

The Oak Hills Local School District raised a total of \$39,888 for the American Heart Association, an all-time record set by the district in one year. Each school put on and participated in jump-a-thons, basketball tournaments and donation drives in order to exceed their goals.



J.F. Dulles, Oakdale Elementary, Delshire Elementary School and Oak Hills High School each reached all-time fundraising records for their building. Kudos to J.F. Dulles, the second highest fundraising school in the Greater Cincinnati area, raising \$13,524!

COMMUNITY IMPACT






TECHNOLOGY & INNOVATION



Classroom learning is enhanced through the daily use of Chromebooks and the Google for Education Suite tools via the district's one-to-one program. Chromebooks provide quick and easy access to technology for all students and allow for an interactive learning experience. We are also very excited to announce the development of a new middle school elective course, Intro to Innovation and Design Thinking.

DAY OF ARTS FOR ALL



VSA Ohio is a community that connects inspired artists with their passion, service providers with resources and all citizens with creative opportunities. Started in 1996, Accessible Expressions Ohio is an adjudicated, statewide exhibition and tour of visual art for artists of all ages with disabilities. This exhibition raises awareness about art and disabilities by presenting the art in inclusive settings. Five OHHS students pieces were selected for the 22nd annual show!

FACILITY IMPROVEMENTS



This year's budgeted building improvements included resurfacing the Oak Hills High School, Delshire, Oakdale and J.F. Dulles parking lots, replacing roofs at OHHS and Delshire and converting an unused locker room into a bright, new art room at Oakdale Elementary School.

GOING GLOBAL

Though not a district-sponsored organization, the Oak Hills Dingolfing, Germany Exchange has afforded OHHS students the opportunity to travel abroad annually since 1985. This year 21 OHHS students participated in the three-week-long student exchange trip. They experienced everyday life in Germany, attending school and living with German families. Unique learning opportunities included a ballroom dance course, a hands-on cooking class and a trip to the local recycling center.
