The Oak Hills Board of Education is currently seeking taxpayer approval for an operating levy on August 7, 2018. If approved, these resources will allow the district to implement additional safety, security and mental health services across all school buildings.

With the assistance of former Green Township Police Chief, Bart West, we have strategically identified recommendations that include adding school police resource officers to cover the high school and middle schools at all times. In addition, the levy would provide armed security assistance with coverage at all elementary buildings, additional mental health specialists to serve students and families and link them to social services, front entrance infrastructure improvements to secure visitor check-in procedures in all buildings, improvements to classroom doors, additional cameras focused on



entrance and exit doors and new technology to directly alert local law enforcement agencies in the event of an emergency.

In addition, funds will assist us in securing our financial position and our rich tradition of excellence and high quality educational opportunities and programs for all students.

We can all agree that times have drastically changed in the area of school safety. These recent tragic and senseless acts of violence have a profound impact on all of us and we are committed to ensuring that the Oak Hills School District is proactive in providing resources to protect our children and staff.
