- Oak Hills High School students met or exceeded the state average in all five tested areas of the ACT.
- We offer the following world languages: Spanish, French, German, Mandarin Chinese and American Sign Language.
- J.F. Dulles and C.O. Harrison Elementary schools piloted first grade Spanish Immersion classrooms.
- We currently offer 11 college credit plus courses through our high school partnerships with Cincinnati State
 and the University of Cincinnati. A total of 184 OHHS students are enrolled in college credit plus courses this
 year
- 726 students took at least one Advanced Placement (AP) test. 1228 AP tests were taken.
- 136 graduates earned an Honors diploma from the Ohio Department of Education
- Within two years of high school approximately 70% of our students enroll in a two or four-year college or are serving in a branch of the U.S. military.
- Our three middle schools and Oak Hills High School are members of the International Studies School Network (ISSN). ISSN is a national consortium of innovative, cutting-edge schools focusing on global education. It includes a network of 35 innovative and highly effective schools from around the nation.
- The Oak Hills School District is the only district in Ohio to have two middle schools (Bridgetown and Rapid Run) designated as an Ohio and National School to Watch.
- Oak Hills High School continues to meet all of the requirements of the AdvancED Accreditation Commission and Board of Trustees and was accredited by the North Central Association Commission on Accreditation and School Improvement.



PARENT AND COMMUNITY INVOLVEMENT



THE OAK HILLS ALUMNI & EDUCATIONAL FOUNDATION SPONSORED THE FUNDRAISING AND MARKETING EFFORTS FOR THE SCOTTIE YARD PLAYGROUND AT OAKDALE ELEMENTARY SCHOOL, RAISING \$208,000 THROUGH PRIVATE DONATIONS, A SUBSTANTIAL GIFT FROM GREEN TOWNSHIP AND FOUNDATION GRANTS. THIS INCLUSIVE AND ACCESSIBLE PLAYGROUND IS THE ONLY ONE IN EXISTENCE IN BOTH DELHI AND GREEN TOWNSHIPS AND WILL BENEFIT ALL STUDENTS IN THE DISTRICT AND COMMUNITY. THE FOUNDATION CONTINUES TO PROVIDE EDUCATION GRANTS FOR CLASSROOM PROJECTS IN EACH OF OUR NINE BUILDINGS.



- ► The Ione Holt Auditorium Renovation Committee was formed to begin fundraising for the auditorium renovations at Oak Hills High School. The entire project cost is roughly \$2.2M and will be funded through HB264 funds, private donations, grants and special events.
- Partnership with Cincinnati Children's Hospital to provide mental health clinical services at OHHS, RRMS, BMS and DMS.
- ► Partnership with Beacon Orthopedics to provide trainer and nursing services to athletes, students and families.
- ► The Oak Hills Athletic Boosters continually raise funds to support the high school coaching staff as well as the band and Oakettes organizations.
- ► The Oak Hills Band Association continually raises funds to support the high school band program.
- ▶ We are lucky to have so many wonderful school volunteers including PTA members, local business partners and alumni who come back to enhance classroom learning by sharing their professional experiences as well as raise money to supplement school activities and events.
- ► Our Business Advisory Council introduces our students to a wide array of postgraduate opportunities through career exploration during the annual 8th grade career fair.

► Rapid Run Middle School partnered with Therapy Pets of Greater Cincinnati to set up a program at the school with animal-assisted activity visits to the specialized classrooms. These classrooms are designed to support the academic, social and emotional needs of individual students. Therapy teams consist of two registered handlers with TPGC and their dogs. Due to the positive impact and success of the pet therapy team visits this year, the program will continue at RRMS and has extended to Oakdale Elementary for the 2015-16 school year.

High school students also have the opportunity to participate in a Capstone Project through our Programs of Study - STEMM, International Studies, Creative and Performing Arts and Integrated Studies. Through the Programs of Study Initiative, students can focus in an area of interest and can earn college credit through the College Credit Plus program in partnership with the University of Cincinnati, Cincinnati State and Sinclair College. In addition, many of our senior students participate in internship programs with local business and organizations to assist them in their preparation for their college/university experience or chosen field of study.

We are pleased that many of our students district-wide participate in community service activities, such as Relay For Life, Games for the Cure, Autism Walk and Annual OHHS Walk to raise funds for the Delhi and Green Township Senior Citizen Centers, The Anderson Ferry Foodbank and the 5K for Haiti. Students at the high school can choose from over 27 different clubs and activities, while middle school students are offered 15 different clubs and activities.
