NAHS members help to organize community art exhibitions, prepare materials for the Alumni Homecoming Dinner and the annual Veteran's Day events, and independent service activities (i.e. murals, craft activities, etc.) related to the arts in the community.

To be eligible for NAHS, students must maintain a 3.0 average in all of their coursework. demonstration art scholarship, obtain art teacher recommendation, and complete a specified amount of service hours throughout the school year. While some of the opportunities are presented for the students, the majority of the hours must be sought out by the students themselves in the community. Benefits include a national membership, recognition at graduation, and the option of a cord to wear at graduation.

The Robotics Team participates in many local charitable activities, as a central tenet of the team is to learn with service. These include, but are not limited to, staffing COSI events at elementary schools, working with distribution of funds students at elementary enrichment days, working with middle school students on our FIRST Lego League Team, building equipment and structures for those in need (Jerry Potavin Assistive Table, Delhi Christmas Parade Sled, etc), and various projects to help out staff around the school.

We plan on competing in three regionals (Miami Valley in Dayton, Chicago, and Pittsburgh) on the FRC level, as well as once again qualifying for World Championships (this year in Detroit).
