

OAK HILLS LOCAL SCHOOL DISTRICT **HEALTH SERVICES NOTIFICATION AND INFORMATION ABOUT BED BUGS**

Dear Parent or Guardian:

We recently found a bed bug in our building this week. FORTUNATELY, SCHOOLS ARE NOT a favorite home for bed bugs because they do not have a host to feed on at night and they hate bright lights during the day. So if a bed bug comes in with a student, it is not likely to travel very far within the classroom or school.

Bed bugs are a nuisance, but their bites are not known to spread disease. Bed bugs are usually active at night and feed on human blood. The bite does not hurt at first, but it may become swollen and itchy, much like a mosquito bite. Watch for clusters of bites, usually in a line, on exposed areas of the body. If you have concerns for you or your child, please contact your doctor.

The source of bed bugs often cannot be determined, as bed bugs may be found in many places including hotels, planes, and movie theaters. Even though it is unlikely for bed bugs to be spread in schools, OHLSD will conduct an inspection and, if needed, will treat the area where the bed bug was found. We ask that you inspect your home and your child's belongings. Please contact the school nurse or principal if you know you have bed bugs in your home so we can make every effort at school to prohibit it from spreading.

OHLSD will continue to work to identify bed bugs, provide thorough inspections of schools, and have licensed pest control specialists treat the rooms if a problem is found. Contact your physician or school nurse for proper care and treatment of bed bug bites.

If you have any questions regarding bed bugs in your school, please contact the principal or school nurse. If you have any questions regarding bed bugs found in your home, search the Central Ohio Bed Bug Task Force or the Hamilton County Health Department. Most licensed pest control companies in our area will do an inspection at no cost and give advice for treatment.

The Sustainability Committee of Mount St. Joseph University and the Oak Hills School District are proud to sponsor a **COMMUNITY ELECTRONICS RECYCLING DAY** on Saturday, April 6th, 2019 from 10 AM - 2 PM in the student parking lot (north lot) of Oak Hills High School. There are no residency requirements to drop off items and ANY item with an electrical cord will be accepted. This includes all TVs (any size), refrigerators and all other household appliances (microwaves, washers, vacuum cleaners, etc.), cell phones, game systems, iPods, Blackberries, MP3 players, digital cameras, GPS units, e-readers, all computers and related accessories (such as keyboards, printers, portable hard drives, and scanners), VCR/DVD/CD players, fax machines, copiers, surge protectors, power cables and charging cords, electronic wiring, and satellite components.

A \$15 donation is requested for each small cathode ray tube (CRT) TV/monitor dropped off and a \$25 donation is requested for each large TV (consoles, large flat screens, and rear projection TVs). For those without TVs to drop off, a \$10 donation is requested per vehicle. These donations help to defray both disposal fees for the hazardous waste components of the items to be recycled and transportation costs.

RecycleForce, a non-profit from Indianapolis, will de-manufacture these items and shred all hard drives to address any privacy concerns. The plastics and metals are then collected, packaged, and sold to build new components, while all toxic elements, such as lead and mercury, will be disposed of properly to avoid environmental contamination. RecycleForce provides transitional jobs to formerly incarcerated people, helping them to rebuild their lives and increase their chances of sustained future employment.
