Students attending athletic events must leave the campus and return no earlier than 4:00 p.m. THE SCHOOL WILL NOT BE HELD RESPONSIBLE FOR THE SUPERVISION OF STUDENTS BEYOND 2:30 p.m.



Just a reminder.... We ask that students come to the health room if they are not feeling well. While I understand that many have cell phones in which they can contact a guardian, it is important that they are assessed in the health room for a communicable illness. It could take a while for transportation to be arranged and your student could be transmitting an illness to other students. This also makes pick up easier as they will be able to pack up their things and be ready to go home when someone arrives to pick them up.

# Dear Oak Hills Parents/Guardians,

Positive Behavioral Interventions & Supports (PBIS), is a broad range of systemic and individualized strategies for achieving important social and learning outcomes in school communities while preventing problem behavior. The key attributes of PBIS include preventive activities, data-based decision making and a problem-solving orientation (Horner, 2000; Lewis & Sugai, 1999; Sugai et.al., 2000; Weigle, 1997). PBIS is implemented in all of our buildings to ensure student learning, both socially and academically.

To strengthen our system and improve student learning, Oak Hills is in our fourth year of utilizing the **Strength and Difficulties Questionnaire** to screen all students K-12 for additional needs that may impede their learning. The Strength and Difficulties Questionnaire is a research-based measure to identify needs in five areas:

- emotional needs
- conduct
- hyperactivity/inattentiveness
- peer relationships
- prosocial behaviors.

Teachers will complete the questionnaire for students in grades K-5, and students will self-report in grades 6-12. The completion of each questionnaire is estimated at 3-5 minute. The Strength and Difficulties Questionnaire is used to identify potential students that would benefit from pro-social and school-based interventions. If concerns are identified, the building team will contact families and determine appropriate next steps. These next steps may include parent reporting and/or team meetings, but will be individualized to student needs with the goal of maximizing student learning. This screen will allow building teams to minimize barriers to learning, build supports to extend learning, and create environments that allow for the development of strong peer relationships.



The Sustainability Committee of Mount St. Joseph University and Great Parks of Hamilton County are proud to sponsor a community electronics recycling day on Saturday, October 13th, in the Mill Race Banquet Center parking lot in Winton Woods. There are no residency requirements to drop off items and ANY item with an electrical cord will be accepted. This includes all TVs (any size), refrigerators and all other household appliances (microwaves, washers, vacuum cleaners, etc.), cell phones, game systems, iPods, Blackberries, MP3 players, digital cameras, GPS units, e-readers, all computers and related accessories (such as keyboards, printers, portable hard drives, and scanners), VCR/DVD/CD players, fax machines, copiers, surge protectors, power cables and charging cords, electronic wiring, and satellite components.

A \$15 donation is requested for each cathode ray tube (CRT) TV/monitor dropped off and a \$25 donation is requested for each large TV (consoles, large flat screens, and rear projection TVs). For those without TVs to drop off, a \$10 donation is requested per vehicle. These donations help to defray both transportation costs and disposal fees for the hazardous waste components of the items to be recycled.

RecycleForce, a non-profit from Indianapolis, will de-manufacture these items and shred all hard drives to address any privacy concerns. The plastics and metals are then collected, packaged, and sold to build new components, while all toxic elements, such as lead and mercury, will be disposed of properly to avoid environmental contamination. RecycleForce provides transitional jobs to formerly incarcerated people, helping them to rebuild their lives and increase their chances of sustained future employment.

In addition to blood pressure checks and guided tours of the station and equipment, there will be hands-on activities to promote fire and safety awareness, including:

- The University Hospital Air Care will land at Our Lady of Victory on the north sports fields (behind church) at 1:00 P.M. Once the aircraft lands, feel free to get an up close look and meet the flight crew! Arrive early to see it land!
- Stop by for an opportunity to learn about the Department's history while viewing the many artifacts on display, including the original fire pumper!
- Kid's Firefighter Challenge Course, for children of all ages who want to suit up and test their firefighter skills and agility (gear only available for kids up to 12 years old).
- The Fire Safety House which teaches life-saving practices on how to safely exit a smoke filled building.
- We will have vintage fire apparatus from the Miles Greenwood Society on display.
- Delhi Township Police Officer Jeff Miller his canine Levi and Fire Investigator Steve Claytor his
  canine Rudy will be there for demonstrations.
- Hamburgers, hot dogs and light refreshments will be provided while supplies last.


