

Qualities to be Considered and Meetings To Attend

PRESIDENT (current officer: Cali Herzog - ELIGIBLE for re-election)

An understanding and belief in PTA objectives and policies. Ability to work with others, lead and inspire others to work. Experience in PTA. Good organizational qualities. Enthusiasm, sense of humor, tact, and energy. Knowledge of parliamentary procedure or willingness to learn. Flexibility. It is wise if this officer does not accept a high office in another unit or council while serving as your unit president.

Meetings a President is EXPECTED TO ATTEND:

RRMS PTA meetings (once a month during the school year on the 2nd Thursday of the month) Council Workshops. Any additional training sessions for presidents. (ex. School of Information)

Oak Hills PTA Advisory Council meetings. Council meetings. State Convention (unit should provide expenses) District six (6) Conferences, if any.

<u>1st VICE-PRESIDENT</u> (aide to President and PTA Volunteer Chairman) (Current officer: Joanna Fecke - ELIGIBLE for re-election)

Ability to replace president when necessary. Same qualities as required for President. Enthusiasm and willingness to work with President. Be in a position to accept the Presidency if nominated.

Creative ability. Good organizational qualities. Take care of details meticulously.

Meetings to attend:

RRMS PTA meetings (once a month during the school year on the 2nd Thursday of the month) Council Workshops. Meetings President cannot attend (ex: Oak Hills PTA Advisory Council).

District six (6) Conference. Miscellaneous others as requested.

<u>2nd VICE-PRESIDENT</u> (aide to President and Ways and Means Programs Chairman) (current officer Maggie Robertson - ELIGIBLE for re-election)

Chairman of Ways and Means – as an aide to the PTA President, the primary responsibility is to delegate and oversee responsibility by securing chairpersons to various fund raising events/activities chosen by the PTA Board. This person must have an understanding of PTA policy and objectives, demonstrate the ability to generate, organize and promote creative ideas, and possess good interpersonal social skills. This position requires considerable time commitment as well as the abilities to handle moneys generated from fund raising activities.

Creative ability. Interest in, and ideas for good student programs. Take care of details meticulously as well as the abilities to handle moneys and budgets related to these activities.

<u>CORRESPONDING SECRETARY</u> (Current Officer: Kristy Robinson - NOT eligible for re-election)

Ability to write letters observing good grammar and good form. Dependability. Promptness in getting out correspondence.

TREASURER (Current officer: Jodee Hebert - ELIGIBLE for re-election)

Knowledge of keeping books. Accuracy. Honesty. Dependability. Knowledge of PTA policies and how PTA moneys are spent. Computer skills and knowledge of Excel and Quicken or Quickbooks, or a willingness to learn.

Meetings to attend:

COUNCIL DELEGATES (Current officer: Sonya King - NOT eligible for re-election)



The Sustainability Committee of Mount St. Joseph University and the Oak Hills School District are proud to sponsor a COMMUNITY ELECTRONICS RECYCLING DAY on Saturday, April 6th, 2019 from 10 AM - 2 PM in the student parking lot (north lot) of Oak Hills High School. There are no residency requirements to drop off items and ANY item with an electrical cord will be accepted. This includes all TVs (any size), refrigerators and all other household appliances (microwaves, washers, vacuum cleaners, etc.), cell phones, game systems, iPods, Blackberries, MP3 players, digital cameras, GPS units, e-readers, all computers and related accessories (such as keyboards, printers, portable hard drives, and scanners), VCR/DVD/CD players, fax machines, copiers, surge protectors, power cables and charging cords, electronic wiring, and satellite components.

A \$15 donation is requested for each small cathode ray tube (CRT) TV/monitor dropped off and a \$25 donation is requested for each large TV (consoles, large flat screens, and rear projection TVs). For those without TVs to drop off, a \$10 donation is requested per vehicle. These donations help to defray both disposal fees for the hazardous waste components of the items to be recycled and transportation costs.

RecycleForce, a non-profit from Indianapolis, will de-manufacture these items and shred all hard drives to address any privacy concerns. The plastics and metals are then collected, packaged, and sold to build new components, while all toxic elements, such as lead and mercury, will be disposed of properly to avoid environmental contamination. RecycleForce provides transitional jobs to formerly incarcerated people, helping them to rebuild their lives and increase their chances of sustained future employment.
