

Dear Rapid Run Parents,

In the coming weeks your child will take the Ohio AIR Assessments in English Language Arts, Math, and 8th Grade Science.

The results of this assessment give us an accurate picture of whether students are on track to be ready for college or a career according the criteria in Ohio's Learning Standards. Our school receives the results in the summer and uses these results to reflect on how we are meeting individual student needs with our curriculum, instruction, and assessment.

This assessment will take place in the morning on the test dates listed below. We ask for your help in preparing your student in the following ways, so we gain the most accurate picture of their progress possible:

- Ensure your child is on time to school on these days. Tests begin after students have had time to get
  organized. Tardy students will either have to scramble to get ready or take the test another day.
- Encourage your child to get a good night's sleep. Energy and attentiveness ensure that students can show what they truly know on the assessment.
- Eating a healthy breakfast. This also helps students have the energy they will need to be attentive during the test.
- <u>Hydrated</u>. Proper hydration is essential to good health, and water bottles will be permitted in the test environment.
- Ensure your child's Chromebook is charged the night before the assessment (if your child takes them home). The AIR assessment is administered through their Chromebooks, and changing computers or looking for a charger can disrupt their testing progress.

Air Quality and the health of our children

Air pollution can make asthma symptoms worse and trigger attacks. If you or your child has asthma, have you ever noticed symptoms get worse when the air is polluted? Air pollution can make it harder to breathe. It can also cause other symptoms, like coughing, wheezing, chest discomfort, and a burning feeling in the lungs. Two key air pollutants can affect asthma. One is ozone (found in smog). The other is particle pollution (found in haze, smoke, and dust). When ozone and particle pollution are in the air, adults and children with asthma are more likely to have symptoms. (https://www3.epa.gov/airnow/asthma-flyer.pdf)

With the warmer weather approaching and the excitement of open the windows for the much needed fresh air. Let's all take a minute and reflect - Are We Doing Our Part?

- If you have asthma issues, do you have your inhaler? Or is your child's on them at school or with the nurse? (students do need a doctor's order on file to carry or have with the nurse, https://www.ohlsd.us/departments/health-room-10/medication-forms-44/)
- Do you sit in the car and smoke while waiting in a parking lot or in carpool? (OHLSD is a smoke free campus)
- Is the car running while you are waiting? If actively moving in line that is one thing but if you are arriving early and idling for 5 minutes or more how much air pollution are we creating? (Please do not idle sitting in the lot especially if close to the building)

Sometimes we do not realized how the little day to day choices, does affect the air we and our children are breathing. Let's do our part to allow all of the OHLSD students, staff and visitors to be free from breathing triggers and a little healthier on our campuses and in our community.


