From the Nurse:

We are starting to see cases of head lice.

We suggest you check your child's hair daily for lice or nits (eggs).



In checking for lice and nits, particular attention should be paid to the hair shaft near the scalp, the back of the neck and behind the ears. Head lice are gray-brown parasites about the size of a typewritten comma that deposit their eggs (nits) with a sticky substance to the hair shaft near the scalp. A louse nit can live up to 10 days off the human host.

People get head lice from direct contact with others who are infested, wearing infested clothing, using infested combs and brushes, lying on infested carpets and beds, and from resting the head against upholstered furniture formerly used by infected persons. Head lice DO NOT fly, but are highly transmittable.

Cooperation between the parents and school is most essential to keep this problem to a minimum. Please check your child's hair weekly for early detection.

Remember, head lice can happen to anyone. There is no shame in having lice.

If you find that your child does have lice and /or nits, please keep your child home and notify the school immediately. Please call the School Nurse for any questions or go to our school website @

Students will receive an invitation packet at the end of March if they have a cumulative 3.75 GPA or higher for the 1st-3rd quarters. The application process will include the following requirements:

Requirements	Max Points	Description
GPA	50	Based on cumulative GPA 1st - 3rd quarter
Service Form	20	List of past 2 years of community service involvement
Student Essay	10	Based on rubric students will be given in invitation packet
Faculty Recommendation	48	Students will pick 3 current teachers to fill out form (2 Core, 1 Encore)
